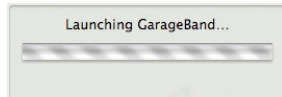
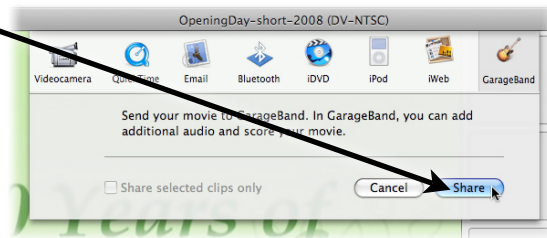
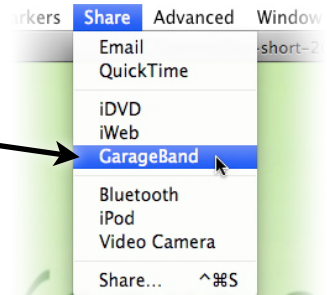


# Assemble an iMovie Soundtrack with GarageBand Loops



## In the iMovie application...

1. After you have completed a movie in iMovie, select **Share | GarageBand**.
2. Select **Share** from the drop-down sheet that appears.



Notice that GarageBand launches.



## In the GarageBand application...

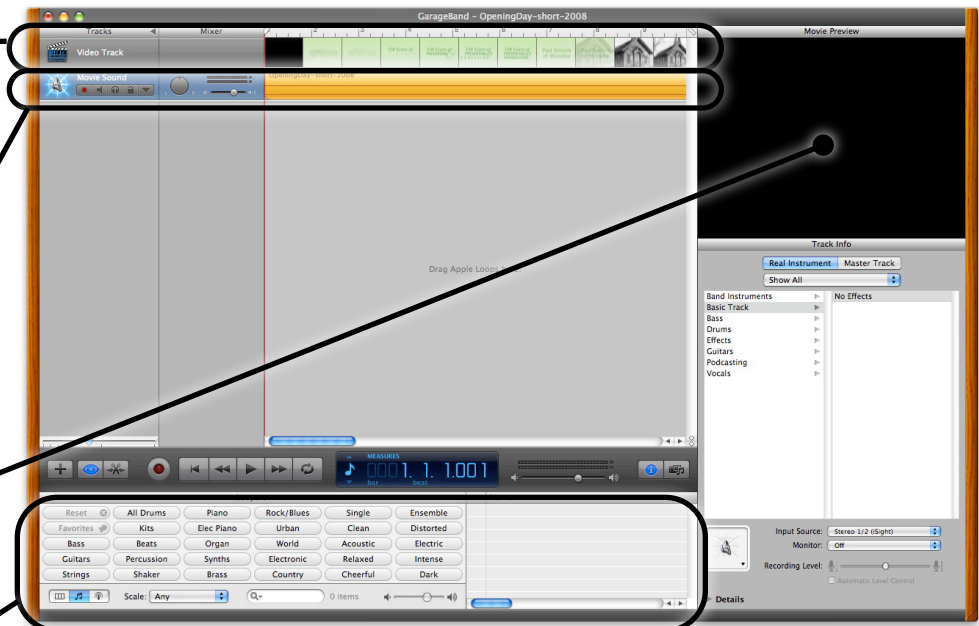
3. GarageBand will open, ready to create a score. Notice the following:

The **Video Track** displays thumbnails (reference pictures) of your movie approximately every 2 seconds.

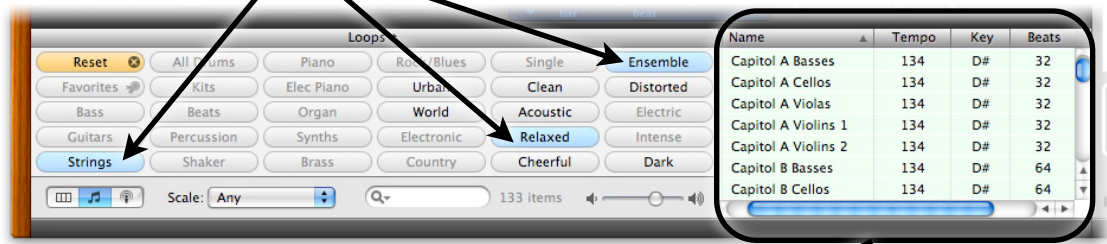
A **Movie Sound** track is created and displayed (this track is a mix of all audio tracks from iMovie).

The **Movie Preview** window is open.

The **Loop Browser** is open.



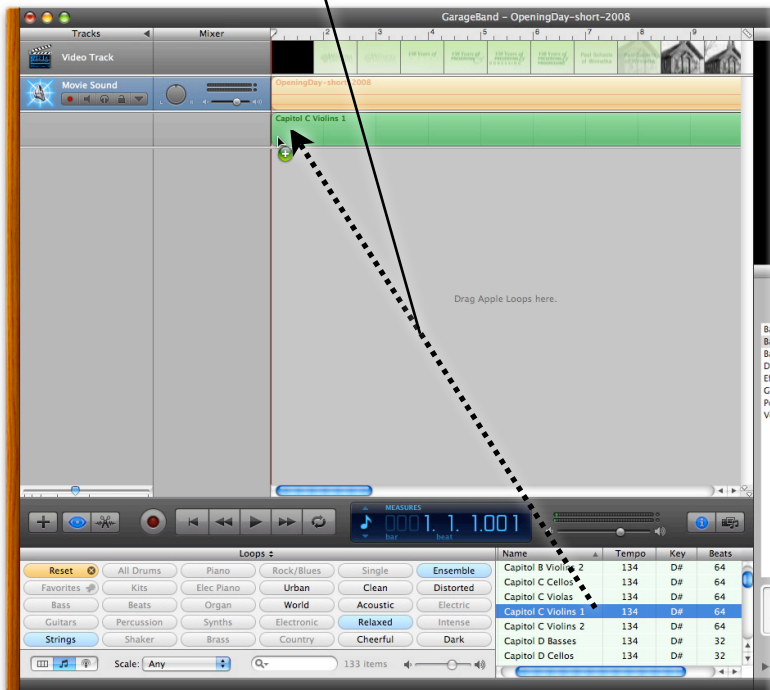
- In the **Loop Browser**, click the buttons that describe the character or attributes of the music you wish to create.



In this example: **Strings** **Relaxed** **Ensemble**

Notice that each button filters the loop results displayed.

- Click a loop to preview it.
- To add a loop to your soundtrack, drag it to a new track.

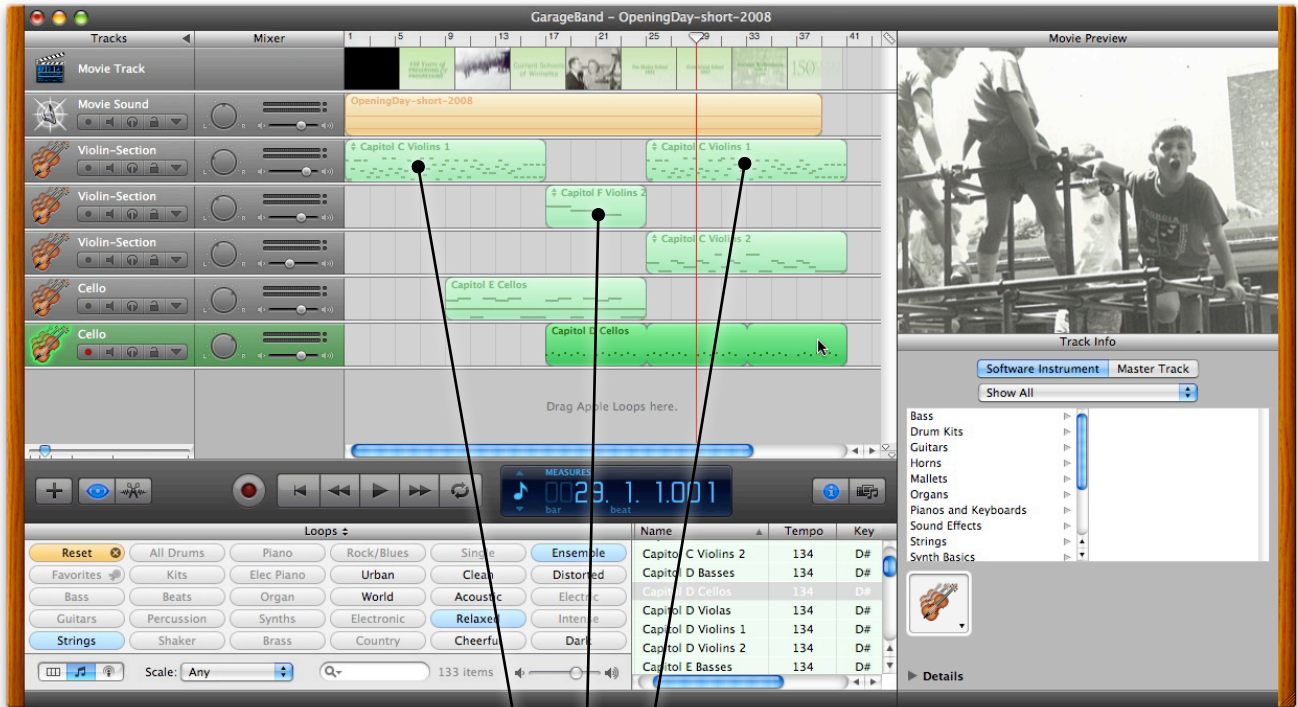


### NOTES

Any loop can be dragged into a track above. This example uses a related set of loops (“Capitol”) to simplify the process and ensure a matching style.

When creating soundtracks, consider mood, character, synchronization to the video track, and the overall tone you wish to convey.

7. Continue to preview and select loops and assemble them into tracks above.



**NOTE**  
This example uses (roughly) the A – B – A musical form.

8. When finished assembling the soundtrack, pull down the **Share** menu and send the completed movie to the destination of your choice:

**iTunes** to watch in iTunes or on an iPod with video

**iWeb** to publish on the Internet

**iDVD** to create a DVD you can watch on a DVD player on a TV
